Who is working on What in Lung Cancer Prevention and Early Detection, Kristy Young, kristy.young@uky.edu

- 28 Network members participated in a call with Kristy to talk about their work in lung cancer prevention and early detection (out of 60 who were on the list when she began)
- The following number of people are working on areas of lung cancer prevention and early detection:
 - Tobacco cessation/treatment – 22 are working on this area
 - Radon Prevention – 9 are working on this area
 - Secondhand smoke – 13 are working on this area
 - Screening for High Risk Populations – 20 are working on this area

- Freedom from Radon Exposure and Smoking in the Home
- Need to recruit more homes that have at least one smoker in the home

- Purposes of the study:
 - Test the effects of FRESH on:
 - home exposure to SHS and radon and the likelihood of taking action among homeowners.
 - Teachable Moment psychosocial factors
 - Examine the differential effects of home smoking on taking action.
 - Explore impact of FRESH on renters
 - Identify factors associated with use of monetary incentive for radon mitigation (simulated tax credit)
- Study Design
 - Randomized Control trial with stratified sampling to ensure equal proportion of those exposed to SHS in the home
 - Recruit homeowners (n= 520) and renters (n= 46)
 - Baseline electronic survey (\$10)
 - Intervention
 - Free home test kits for radon and SHS
 - Environmental feedback intervention post results (8-10 weeks post-enrollment)
 - Follow up online surveys to assess behavior change (3-9-15 mos; \$20-\$30-\$40)
 - 17-month home testing
