- Regarding: Creation of Mission/Vision Statement for KCC Survivorship Committee
 - o The mission/vision statement, definition of cancer survivor, and September meeting minutes were added to the KCC Survivorship Committee webpage.

Discussion Items at January 2010 meeting: "What are your organization's "Big 3" this winter/spring?

- KDPH Colon Cancer Screening Program conducting two pilot projects (Pike and Fleming Counties). Thursday, January 14th, there will be a Cabinet Health and Welfare Committee meeting to vote on whether proposed funding of a statewide program should proceed to the Appropriations and Revenue Committee. Also working with Colon Cancer Prevention Project on building a Super-Colon exhibit for touring around Kentucky.
- UK College of Medicine, Dept. of Behavioral Science: Jamie continues to study behavioral aspects of cancer prevention and control. Tobacco focused grant from NIH regarding participation in clinical trials. Discussed evidence-based practices and the disconnect

- between data/literature and translating it all into practice. NIH is investing in this translation.
- American Cancer Society: Lobby days in Frankfort (Louisville area volunteers to go on the 24^{th)}. Relay for Lifes to be held in each county. For first time, they will be combining all Louisville races into one Cardinal Stadium May 21. Living Well Workshop - currently training educators. All people with chronic illness, not just cancer. Strong in Louisville, slower in rest of the state. Pilot from Stanford. Contact Rita for more information. ritajosephosu@juno.com
 - o Health Reform legislation biggest issues affecting cancer survivors: age of entering Medicare; and pre-existing conditions clauses. Hospice benefits would be 7% ↓ now in reform bill.
- Leukemia and Lymphoma Society covers all of Kentucky and 16 counties in Southern
 Indiana. Note they have a new mailing address. http://www.leukemia-lymphoma.org/all_page?item_id=5015 Working with Dr. Hayslip (University of Kentucky) in eastern Kentucky via a CDC grant, series of clinical trials on educating healthcare providers.

- UK HEEL their volunteer groups that sew/knit hats and blankets for cancer patients. Big
 project right now is health literacy. Humana/UK Healthcare are partnering on a Health
 Literacy Summit in Louisville Feb 26th. Goal is to develop a state coalition on health literacy.

- Gildas Club Louisville Sponsoring 'Rhythm on the River', a giant drum circle, April 11 on water front. Will invite other organizations who are resources for survivors.  September. Survivors lead walk. They are adding a five-K run moving it to Belvedere. Will

- Friend for Life Network will be hosting volunteer trainings in March and April. Cancer survivor forms are on website. http://www.friend4life.org/index.php Nicole is working on social networking and Twitter. Also partnering with a medical school project, where first year med students are spoken to by group of cancer survivors. Would like to expand this to nursing school as well.
- Patient Advocate Foundation. Has spoken at KCP events, re: what PAF does, etc. They now
 do intake for ACS and LAF. Last year 180,000 called PAF from Kentucky. Break away from

- Division of Women's Health Just hired B&C recruiter (to recruit rarely and never screened)

 Roanya Rice. She will attend Survivorship Committee mtgs in the future. Asking for more
 to screen more people (CDC), some is put towards coalitions (59 of them) across the state.

 Web page/blog Roanya will set up so coalitions can see what all is going on and utilize eachothers' resources/ideas. Breast cancer trust fund. \$250,000 in up to \$20,000 grants.
