

The **Kentucky Cancer Summit Poster Gallery** offers organizations the opportunity to share their local, regional, or statewide efforts in cancer prevention or screening. The Gallery provides an informal venue to display basic information about cancer awareness campaigns, survivorship initiatives, worksite wellness projects, educational programs, patient navigation successes, tobacco cessation work – any effort your organization has made towards reducing the cancer burden in our state.

This is not to be an academic poster session, but instead a grassroots, “on the ground” look at what our partners are achieving throughout the state. The Summit offers the ideal venue for us to network, share and perhaps create new collaborations as we learn more about one another’s good work. Bring your business card!

If you have your own poster easel, we ask that you bring it with you. If you do not have an easel, one can be provided. **Posters must be mounted on foam core to be displayed properly, and should not be larger than 48 x 36.**

Poster set up time: Posters may be set up in View Pointe North between 4pm and 5pm on Wednesday, or between 7:15am and 8:00am on Thursday morning. If this does not accommodate your schedule, please let Katie Bathje know at katie@kycancerc.org and we will make note of your arrival.

Poster take down time: Please remove your poster and easel by 4pm on Thursday, March 2nd.

Poster gallery viewing: Attendees would be available to browse the poster gallery during the following times in the Summit schedule:

- Wednesday evening during registration/refreshment hour: 5:00pm – 5:45pm
- Thursday morning during registration: 8:00am – 9:00am
- Thursday “Exhibits and Poster Gallery Break”: 11:30am – 12:00pm
- Thursday during Networking Lunch: 12:00pm – 1:00pm

While you are certainly not required to stand next to your poster during these times, you may want to make yourself available for a portion of one of the slots above.
