



27,000 new cases of **Human Papilloma Virus** related cancers are diagnosed each year, with 70% of cervical cancer cases being attributed to two strains of HPV. The HPV vaccine has the potential to reduce HPV related cancers by an estimated two-thirds.

The **National AHEC Organization HPV Immunization Project**, funded by the **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention**, seeks to further educate providers and give them the tools they need to take a stand to prevent cancer and make a strong vaccine recommendation to their patients. Together, with help from state AHECs throughout the nation, these organizations present a **one-hour educational offering** entitled:

“You Are the Key to HPV Cancer Prevention: Understanding the Burden of HPV Disease, the Importance of the HPV Vaccination Recommendation, and Communicating about HPV Vaccination”
