“Colorectal Cancer Screening: Reaching Our Vulnerable Patient Populations”

**Daniel S. Reuland, MD MPH**

Professor of Medicine

Division of General Medicine and Clinical Epidemiology

University of North Carolina School of Medicine

Dr. Reuland's research interests include developing and testing interventions aimed at improving cancer screening. Much of his work focuses on improving screening-related communication, decision making, and behaviors in vulnerable primary care populations. He is a past recipient of the American Cancer Society (ACS) Cancer Control Career Development Award for Primary Care Physicians. He is now principal investigator of a multi-site, clinical trial funded by an ACS Research Scholar Grant testing a colorectal cancer screening intervention in safety net primary care settings. He also directs the Carolina Cancer Screening Initiative, a program sponsored by the UNC Lineberger Comprehensive Cancer Center.

Dr. Morris is a Professor of Surgery, Vice Chair of Clinical Research, and Director of the S-SPIRE Center. Dr. Morris' research interests include socio-demographic disparities in cancer outcomes, patient-physician relationships and patient-centered outcomes, and health-related policy and quality of care. She is completing an American Cancer Society-funded mixed methods study of patient and provider influences on the quality of colorectal cancer care. She was recently a Visiting Scholar at the Russell Sage Foundation studying the quality of care in safety net hospitals and is a member of the NQF Consensus Standards and Approval Committee.
