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ACA & Cancer	 Trump Administration Loosens Restrictions On Short-Term Health Plans CMS Resumes ACA Risk Adjustment Payments: CMS announced it will continue payments—amounting to \$10.4 billion—to the Affordable Care Act's (ACA) risk-adjustment program. The program was established to ensure that risk is spread across insurance companies. Recently, in one of the many efforts to dismantle the ACA, CMS announced that it would halt the payments. Insurers responded to CMS' move by warning about the possibility of raising next year's ACA premiums due to unpredictability of risk adjustment payments.
