Kentucky Radon Facts

- Leading cause of lung cancer among non-smokers found everywhere in Kentucky
- Nationally 7% of buildings \geq 4.0 pCi/L (Kentucky 42%)¹
- Nationally 1.3 pCi/L average concentration (Kentucky 6.7 pCi/L)¹
- 700(+/-) new radon-induced lung cancer incidents per year²
 500(+/-) radon-induced lung cancer deaths per year²
- Economic impact \$200(+/-) million dollars per year²
- Radon policies provide little (no) protection for Kentuckians






Investigative Report – WHAS 11 (Louisville)

NRAP Leadership Team Washington, DC July 11, 2018



Background

- Radon awareness policies in IL and MN include:
 - Disclosure to be signed by buying party at the time an offer is written
 - Materials to educate buying party on importance of testing for radon
- Radon awareness policy results include:
 - ~10% national average testing at time of real estate transaction
 - ~60% average in IL (expected similar result in MN)
 - Increase in mitigation aligned with testing increase

Policy Timeline

- Q3 2017:
 - Coalition identifies awareness policy as 2018 legislative initiative
 - ALA and KARP outline initiative with MMLK (government affairs team)
- Q4 2017:
 - Legislator identified to carry bill during 2018 session
 - Draft bill developed by team ALA, KARP, MMLK
 - Education efforts to key legislators begin
 - Outreach meeting with key stakeholder group held

Policy Timeline

- Q1 2018:
 - Stakeholder feedback provided willingness to support initiative, recommendation to consider alternative approach
 - Legislator briefed bill not introduced, alternative approach adopted
- Q2 2018:
 - Stakeholder meetings held to develop strategy for implementation of alternative approach
 - Policy adoption pending approval of KREC (real estate commission)
 - Education campaign in development (ALA grant)

Radon Warning Statement

- Included on Seller's Disclosure of Property Condition
 - Signed by buyer at the time of offer to purchase
 - Prominent positioning on form callout
 - Modifies existing radon information on form
 - Eliminates additional forms (stakeholder feedback)
 - Provides URL for additional information (stakeholder feedback)

Radon Warning Statement

METHAMPHETAMINE CONTAMINATION DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENT

A property owner who chooses **NOT** to decontaminate a property used in the production of methamphetamine **MUST** make written disclosure of methamphetamine contamination pursuant to KRS 224.1-410(10) and 902 KAR 47:200. Failure to properly disclose methamphetamine contamination is a Class D Felony under KRS 224.99-010.

Radon Warning Statement:

Every buyer of any interest in residential real property is notified that the property may present exposure to dangerous levels of indoor radon gas that may place the occupants at risk for developing radon-induced lung cancer. The Department for Public Health strongly recommends that all homebuyers have an indoor radon test performed prior to purchase or taking occupancy, and mitigated if elevated levels are found. Education Campaign

- An opportunity exists to use the policy initiative to educate real estate agents
- Utilizing a grant provided by ALA:
 - Develop targeted messaging and materials for real estate agents (work with KY Realtors®)
 - Identify and engage outside voices to educate the public (work with CanSAR)
 - Develop media campaign op-eds, letters to editor, media pitches and monitoring
 - Develop social media campaign shareable content, resource toolkit

Other Coalition Initiatives

- Contractor Lawsuit Settlement
 - Injunction issued June 2015 preventing regulations from going into effect
 - Contractors remain unregulated consumer protection issue
 / industry protection issue
- Child Care / School Policy Initiatives
 - Potential bill introduction this session requiring child care centers and schools to conduct radon testing
- CDC Webinar 1/31/2019 (pending reschedule)
 - Webinar delivered to state cancer control personnel
 - Kentucky viewed as model state for radon policy
- Environmental Justice Pilot Project Louisville
 - Pilot EJ project targeting testing and mitigation in low income homes – potential for future expansion
