As a major component of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, DPH provides guidance and support for health departments in all 120 counties.



#### **Lung Cancer Screening**


- Four questions about lung cancer screening were added in the 2017 Kentucky Behavioral Risk Factor Survey (KyBRFS)
- These questions were asked to current and former smokers:
  - 1) How old were you when you first started to smoke cigarettes regularly?
  - 2) How old were you when you last smoked cigarettes regularly?
  - 3) On average, when you [smoke/ smoked] regularly, about how many cigarettes {do/did} you usually smoke each day?
  - 4) The next question is about CT or CAT scans. During this test, you lie flat on your back on a table. While you hold your breath, the table moves through a donut shaped x-ray machine while the scan is done. In the last 12 months, did you have a CT or CAT scan?

## Current Smokers (55-80 years)


The prevalence of current smokers between the ages of 55-80 was 19.9%




### Current Smoker by Gender (55-80 years)




#### Current Smoker by Race/Ethnicity (55-80 years)




### Current Smoker by Education Status (55-80 years)



### Current Smoker by Income Level (55-80 years)






#### Responses to Module Questions

- How old were you when you first started to smoke cigarettes regularly?
  - ➤ Majority (45%) started smoking between 15-18 years of age
- How old were you when you last smoked cigarettes regularly?
  - ➤ Majority (35%) stopped smoking between the ages of 50-60 years of age
- On average, how many cigarettes do you smoke each day?
  - ➤ Majority (32%) smoked 2 packs/day or 20 cigarettes/day


### Had Low Dose CAT SCAN done in the past 12 months (55-80 years)




#### CAT Scan Done for Lung Cancer by Gender (55-80 years)




# CAT Scan Done for Lung Cancer by Race/Ethnicity (55-80 years)
