EVIDENCE BASED PRACTICE: Every patient willing to make a quit attempt should be encouraged treatment that includes counseling (problem solving and support) and medications (USPSTF)

- KDPH and KCC will provide scholarships to CTTS
- What trainings do we already have?

PROGRESS:

- What progress is being made?
- What proportion of the population is covered?
- Possible questions – (what information do we already have? See UK BREATHE)
 - # screened patients for tobacco use?
 - # received tobacco cessation counseling?
 - # received nicotine replacement therapy?
 - # received non-nicotine cessation medications?
 - Current smoke-free policies in worksites, schools and communities

Lung Cancer Screening Awareness Campaign

ACTION ITEM: What campaigns are already developed? In KY, Nationally

NEED: Lung Cancer Screening campaign with a comprehensive message: include education and counseling on tobacco treatment, second hand smoke, radon; shared decision making; and messages that do not stigmatize lung cancer.

Increase screening leads to increase treatment and decreases all causes mortality, not just lung cancer

Connect with Kentucky Health Collaborative. They currently have a Tobacco Committee, considering to form a Lung Cancer Screening Committee.
