













In this case, the message is from a local Kentuckian who is a colon cancer survivor encouraging them and guiding them on how to complete their FIT test for colon cancer screening.

Colorectal Cancer Screening, Prevention, and Coding Update

Kentucky leads the nation in coloractal cancer (CRC) incidence SCIN over and under age 50.* But did you know Kentucky has the strongest, most unique insurance coverage for CRC screening and prevention? Here are 4 critical coverage facts you need to follow to increase screenings and prevent CRC in your practice or network. The following apply to most fully-funded commercial plans regulated by the Kentucky Department of Insurance AND Medicaid. Call your insurance company for details.

They DO NOT APPLY to Medicare products.

SCREENING FOR ALL (KRS 214.540-214.544)

The Kentucky Colon Cancer Screening Program (KCCSP) is a statewide program for the uninsured and underinsured to provide **no or low cost** colonoscopies for: A) those who qualify as high risk; or

B) normal risk persons with a positive FIT or Stool DNA test.

Your patient can call (877) 597-4655 toll-free for details and to see if they qualify.

UPDATED SCREENING AGE (KRS 304.17A-257)

The NEW age to start preventative screening for CRC has been lowered from age 50 to age 45, based on the newest American Concer Society guidelines, which Kentucky follows.

SCREENING COLONOSCOPY (KRS 304.17A-257)

A screening colonoscopy is to be coded as such regardless of what is found (polyps, tumors mucosal abnormalities) and regardless of what intervention is performed as a result. The code of screening remains the base code regardless of add storal added codes/interventions.

ALSO, all calanoscopies which are performed to complete screening for a positive noninvasive fecal test (FIT or stool DNA) should be coded as a screening colonoscopy, not coded as a diagnostic.

GENETIC TESTING FOR CANCER RISK (KRS 304.17A-259)

Beginning in January 2020, testing for hereditary cancers (colon, pancreatic, gastric, breast, ovarian, endometrial, pancreatic, prostate, melanoma, others) for persons who meet national guidelines for testing INCONI will be completely covered by private insurance in Kentucky as a preventative service.

The KCC Lung Cancer Network designated as the Community Advisory Board for the KY LEADS Collaborative quality implementation of lung cancer screening component.

2022

Kentucky General Assembly passed legislation to establish a lung cancer screening program. Continued and expanded efforts also through:

Awareness Resolutions

- •HR74/SR 112: National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month and March 4, 2022, as Dress in Blue Day
- •SR 210: Bring awareness to Oral Cancer

Tobacco and Radon Bills

- •HB 199: AN ACT prohibiting smoking in public places and places of employment.
- •SB 166: AN ACT relating to the regulation of tobacco products and vapor products.
- •HB 400: AN ACT relating to employment discrimination based on smoking.
- HB 190: Cigarette surtax increase, floor stock tax imposition
- •HB 201: Vaping; Excise tax, imposition
- •HB 77: AN ACT relating to radon safety.
