Statewide Tobacco Coalition - Amanda Bucher, UK BREATHE - amanda.bucher@uky.edu

Partners are combining efforts to form a coalition for tobacco control policies, focusing on preventing tobacco dependence rather than statewide smoke-free policies.

Tobacco Retail Licensing - Shannon Baker, American Lung Association - shannon.baker@lung.org

Discussed the need for tobacco retail licensing in Kentucky, highlighting past legislative attempts and future plans to introduce meaningful legislation to protect against underage sales.

Juul Settlement Funding - Jason Baird, Limestone Group - jason@limestonegrp.com

Discussed efforts to allocate Juul settlement dollars towards smoking cessation and anti-vaping programs, with plans to introduce bills in the next session.

Discussed updates on growing trends and issues surrounding medical debt. Vigilance is needed regarding potential federal-level changes to Medicaid and ACA coverage, which could significantly impact state policies. Coverage for Breast Exams, Susan G. Komen, Lauren Marquette - Imarquette@komen.org

Discussed the recently passed <u>HB115</u> in Kentucky that mandates health insurance coverage for diagnostic and supplemental breast exams without cost-sharing, such as copays and deductibles. It is important to monitor for compliance and file complaints if issues arise. How to file a complaint – click <u>here</u>.

Discussed the importance of protecting and expanding healthcare access in Kentucky, particularly for children, by advocating for continuous Medicaid coverage for kids aged 0-6. Also discussed the potential benefits that an All-Payer Claims Database would provide policymakers with accurate data to improve healthcare outcomes, reduce disparities, and address workforce shortages. Non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) is a critical solution to improve care continuity for Kentuckians with all insurance types. Legislative efforts and surveys are ongoing to gather input on NEMT services.
